

SHOES THAT GROW PART 1 (2018)

Purpose: To deliver shoes to children living in the poorest boroughs of Havana who were identified by our partners in Cuba as having a pressing need for donations. A shoe that grows is a very durable chaco-style shoe made out of tire rubber, which is sold to us for \$16 dollars plus shipping costs by *The Shoes That Grow Foundation* through *Because International, Inc.* The shoes get their name from the straps that adjust in five different places, allowing them to grow with a child for up to five years.
